Aimee has spent time studying items and articles held in the Shetland Museum and the evening began with Aimee sharing some of the interesting accounts of women in Shetland from that time and the contribution they made to the war effort. Shetland Poet Peter Ratter followed, using poetry to focus visitors attention on the propaganda, realities and universal themes of loss suffered in WW1 which continues across the world today. Bressay History Group

The History Group took part in events to commemorate the 100-year anniversary of the armistice which ended the first world war. We took along a display to the Festival Of Remembrance held at the Clickimin on Saturday the 10th, an event which showcased information gathered from across Shetland on the impact of the First World War. On the 11th of November we joined many other communities across the UK lighting beacons with a bonfire on the Wart Hill. Wet wood made for a slow start but finally the folk who'd made the trip up to the quarry enjoyed a blaze clearly visible from the Heritage Centre. Refreshments followed at the Heritage Centre and folk browsed our WW1 displays including the display which had been at the Clickimin the day before and newly acquired Admiralty correspondence detailing the plans to erect the Bard and Aith guns.

Round up from the Noss Warden

The fine weather Shetland enjoyed in 2018 resulted in a good season for Noss, in terms of both visitor numbers and breeding success of the nesting seabirds. It was a busy year with a total of 2,292 visitors, the busiest since 1990. The dramatic views of the Gannet colony on the cliffs were the highlight for most visitors, however close up views of Puffins were also popular, especially with photographers. There was a big turnout for Noss Open Day with 366 people making the trip across Noss Sound on a glorious sunny day to enjoy the variety of activities on offer, including rock pooling, face painting, guided walks, refreshments and even a live harpist who provided an atmospheric soundtrack to the day. A few very lucky visitors were treated to incredibly close views of Orca on 1st July when a pod of 7 swam through Noss Sound twice in one afternoon. Other visitors have been wowed by touching-distance views of a curious and confiding Otter which has frequented the cottage area of the island.

Many of the breeding seabirds had one of the best seasons in recent years. 2018 marked the full island count for Bonxies, something which happens every six years, and the population was found to be up slightly with 476 Bonxie territories counted compared to 465 in 2013. After a poor breeding season last year when the Bonxies fledged no young at all within the annual study plots, a total of 15 were found to fledge this year. The Kittiwake, which has struggled not only in Noss but across the rest of the UK, had a significantly better year this year, with an increase in both nesting pairs and number of chicks fledged. The Arctic Terns also had an exceptionally good year, and possibly the best year on record with 46 chicks fledging from 55 nests, impressive when compared with only three chicks fledging from 51 nests last year. The Shags had a late start to the year and although the numbers of nests were down slightly on last year, they were much more successful at fledging chicks this year. Fulmar, Guillemot and Gannet numbers were stable compared to last year.



Bressay parkrun continues to thrive with an average of 40.8 runners per week. We reached 71 participants during the week of Tom Wills and Andrea Sanchez' wedding. Recent highlights have included fancy dress for the 70th anniversary of the NHS and the warm welcome to Wool Week which saw knitted marshals along the route and the majority of parkrunners sporting a Fair Isle garment. Interest continues to grow for Bressay parkrun outside Shetland and there has yet to be a week when we don't have a visitor from outwith Shetland. The visitors pin board in the Speldiburn Café has been very successful and is a great indicator of how far parkrun tourism reaches.

The organisers are very grateful to all the folk who volunteer, especially those in the Speldiburn Café whose warm welcome is becoming well known throughout the global parkrun community. New volunteers are always appreciated so please e-mail
