We love our school building

BDL is continuing to investigate community ownership of the school through an Asset Transfer, a process allowing community groups to buy or rent publicly owned buildings which they could make better use of, often for a nominal amount. A grant from the Scottish Land Fund has been used to conduct surveys and investigations to help inform on the implications of running costs, maintenance and improvements in the coming years. Jackie has been gathering this information but a key element for future planning is the input the Bressay community can provide. Facilities at the school are providing a real benefit to Bressay but we want to continue to build on this and we want the community to feel welcome to bring their ideas and thoughts so that more of us can benefit in the future.

BDL future plans - we need your views

Our new part-time Development Officer is Chris Dyer. Chris will be working on developing tourism within Bressay and has been liaising with the wardens in Noss to encourage visitors to spend more time in the island and visit other attractions. Since January 2018, 934 participants have completed 3,039 individual parkruns in Bressay covering a total distance of 15,195 km, including 577 new Personal Bests. Seventy Six walkers, runners and joggers took part in sunshine in Bressay's 71st Parkrun on the 15th of June.
