The Brenda May Be Saved

12 Bressay folk volunteered to help with the long term preservation of the *Brenda* at the *Brenda* film night at the Bressay Hall, on 20th March.

A 'Brenda' group of volunteers (Theo Smith, John Clark and Bernard Redman) as part of the Bressay History Group, met Dougie Stevenson of Malakoff Ltd and Norman Moncrieff and Charlie Simpson to agree a form of presentation to the Shetland Amenity Trust and Shetland Islands Council with a view to these bodies rescinding their ownership of the *Brenda*. The presentation to the owners on 12th April included an illustrated history, plus an offer by Malakoff Ltd to uplift the Brenda and store under cover at no charge and with no time limit. This extremely kind offer has now been accepted in writing, and so now in late May we anticipate the *Brenda* being shifted and then temporarily stored in a big shed at the Greenhead out of the weather, which will stop her deteriorating even further. Due to Health and Safety Regulations no volunteers are allowed to assist in the uplifting of the Brenda, or work on the Brenda while it is at the Greenhead.

This is very good news for this old lady, a rare survivor from the First World War. More '*Brenda*' news to follow in the next issue of this newsletter.


