Bressay Development update

Speldiburn is Special

Full details of all our recent progress at Speldiburn can be found in our special edition newsletter. But here's a quick run through: -

- BDL has completed the Community Asset Transfer of the school and surrounding site from the SIC.
- We have completed the 'Speldiburn green upgrade'.
 Our 40 solar panels, extra insulation and air source heating have reduced our 1st electric bill by 60%
- We're delighted to welcome back our customers to the cafe and Good As New, regulars and visitors alike.
- We have completed a feasibility study and submitted a Crown Estate Grant application to fund an architect to reconfigure the building ensuring BDL and our tenants can maximise the Speldiburn to its full potential.
- We have used Tourism Recovery Funding provided by HIE to produce new panels which include lots of visitor information and tell the history of the Bressay Primary School and Speldiburn.

Community Garden

We would like to thank everyone who has been in touch with their views on a possible community garden space near Fullaburn. A handful of responders said that they would welcome additional growing space and we received feedback on various items, in particular the following: -

- The garden area between the Galley Shed and Playpark should be restored for community use.
- The space below Hamilton Park is a really valued playarea which should be left un-changed.
- Wish to see Farmers' Markets / more access to local food.

Here's a mix of comments we received: -

"Great idea! Look forward to this!"

"My only comment is that it would be a shame to lose the 'community garden' next to the galley shed. Even if it is a poor state now, this could be a community project to make it nicer."

"A centralised community market held in the hall, say once a month or whenever, could be one answer, similar to morning or afternoon teas, or fish and chip days. Being periodical it shouldn't take away too much from the shop."

'Yes we would like to see an allotment/gardening space near our house'

'We strongly disagree with the use of the space at Hamilton Park for this.....the children play in this area frequently'

'We think the idea is wonderful and would be willing to help in whatever way'.

'I wonder if it would be worth BDL speaking to folk/crofters who currently grow fruit and veg and look to gather any surplus produce from them to sell to the community?'

"The area next to the play park was, I thought, originally planted to make a pleasant, peaceful area to wander, which indeed it nearly was, but the trees are being choked with grass, the gate has fallen off its hinges, and it lacks a chair or bench on which to sit and think a while. I don't recall who set this wee area up in the first place, but it's such a shame that no interest has been taken in its upkeep or maintenance. It could be a nice amenity if looked after."

"Excellent idea! Hope it comes to fruition"

"I believe the council has a legal duty to provide allotments if anyone requests it."

Noss Sound. Sunday 13th June. Meet at 10am at Noss Sound Car Park.

Grade: Medium. Length. 3 miles. Duration. 3 hours.

A tapestry of over four thousand years of visible human history within the spectacular environs of a National Nature Reserve. The island of Noss is open from May-August; spectacular seabird colonies, wild moorland, vernacular architecture, flora and fauna. The adjacent landscape includes the well-preserved remains of an Iron Age broch, Viking longhouse and post-medieval ruinous crofting remains.

Culliesbrough. Sunday 4th July. Meet at 1pm at Culliesbrough Car Park/Road End.

Grade: Easy. Length. 3 miles. Duration. 2.5 hours.

This sheltered bay, rich fishing grounds and good quality land have attracted people to live at Culliesbrough for thousands of years. The remains of the deserted structures are preserved within the landscape and span a Bronze Age burnt mound, Iron Age broch, Pictish symbol stone, Viking/Norse structures, an early Christian chapel and graveyard and post-medieval domestic residences.

Aith - Sunday 25th July. Meet at 1pm opposite Bruntland.

Grade: Medium. Length. 4 miles. Duration. 3 hours.

The northernmost point of the island of Bressay takes in spectacular coastal scenery. An abandoned fishing station, nineteenth century sandstone quarries, a broch, Viking remains and a magnificent Great War naval gun and ammunition store.

Bressay Lighthouse. Sunday 8th August. Meet at 1pm at Bressay Lighthouse.

Grade: Easy. Length. 1 mile. Duration. 2 hours.

Situated on a rocky headland at the south entrance to Lerwick Harbour, Bressay Lighthouse is an iconic image for any visitor to the isles. Built in 1858, to this day passing the 'Bressa Light' is the starting and finishing point for any journey to or from Shetland by sea and is a landmark for locals and visitors.
