#### Dan a days. Three Tammies fae Gorie

Like his father and grandfather before him, Tammie Laurenson of Gorie (1906-1980) went to sea. In this picture from his niece Margaret Findlay's collection we see young Tammie on his first voyage to the South Atlantic in 1924, learning to steer a compass course aboard Christian Salvesen's ship s.s. Sevilla. In the second picture, taken on the briggistanes at Gorie in 1937, Tammie's father, Aald Tammie (1854-1938), keeps a lookout with his prized binoculars. His father, also Tammie, was born in Culbinsbrough in 1795 and died at Gorie in 1883.



#### **Brough Loch woodland**

Informal meetings including BDL, members of the community and Nathalie Pion (RSPB) have resulted in a survey of the 2.8ha area between the west shore of the Brough loch and the Gorie track. Plans so far, include initial ideas for fencing, gates, tree species and wider community aims. A map has been produced showing the vegetation cover in the area, which is a mix of heath and semiimproved grassland, along with a species list for bird and plants - a total of 36 species of plants have been identified!

#### **Bressay History Group Update**

Commander Claes Jansen Bruyn. Bressay History Group has been very busy this summer at Culliesbrough and is now researching a most interesting gravestone within the kirk walls.

Claes Jansen Bruyn was Commander of the Amboina, a vessel of the Dutch East India Company. She had sailed as escort from Surat, in the Indian Ocean, on 9th February 1636. Delay caused her to miss the Dutch convoy at Cape of Good Hope and she left Table Bay on 9th May, on her own, for a terrible voyage of headwinds and disease amongst the crew. The Amboina turned up in the Bressay Sound on 24th August with 29 of her crew perished. The surviving crew of 20 were offered shelter within Bressay. Commander Bruyn died the following day. In 1637, a memorial stone was shipped from Holland to mark his grave at Culliesbrough.

Bressay History Group hope to install a small interpretation panel adjacent to the gravestone to tell this fascinating tale and a winter project is to acquire a copy of the Bruyn family Crest from the archive of the Dutch East India Company in addition to an archive drawing of the Amboina.
