# Charlie Umphray Exhibition at Speldiburn



A display of Charlie Umphray's photographs, focusing on birds, is now on show in Speldiburn's exhibition space. Featuring a fantastic range of regular visitors as well as rare birds, this collection captures stunning colour, delightful details and charming moments from the natural world - all taken in Bressay.

Charlie bought his first camera in 2005 after seeing a friend enjoying photography. We asked Charlie about what inspires him:

"I've always had an interest in birds and wildlife. We were brought up never to hurt birds or wildlife by my father and grandfather. They were both fishermen and very superstitious, and reckoned that it's very unlucky to harm birds or wildlife. That's probably why I've always had an interest in photographing birds since I started with photography. I wish I'd had a camera when I was younger and at the fishing.

The most exciting bird-sighting on Bressay is probably the Leucistic (White) Sparrow, because I'd never heard of them before I saw one at our bird feeder in April this year."
